There are thousands of books on so many different topics: biographies, scripture, contemplative prayer, spirituality, etc. etc. etc. I tell myself, “Michael: you don’t need to read every book in this place!” I also tell myself to choose ONE book at the beginning of the week that I will take home with me to return later. Inevitably, though, I finish it in a few days and am then tasked with finding a different one. When

this happened the last time, I found out Denise and Sister had told each other they knew I’d finish that first book and not take it home. I’m pretty predictable, I guess.

This particular time, I took home “Particular Examen: How to Root Out Hidden Faults” by Father James F. McElhone, C.S.C. As two of my brothers are Holy Cross priests (C.S.C.), I thought it would be an interesting read. Although written in 1952, it is timeless in that it helps you to really root out your sins, much more than any handout sheet or mobile phone app you’d use before Reconciliation. The downside: I may be spending an inordinate amount of time in the confessional!

My favorite place in the library, and where I’m usually to be found, is pictured in the accompanying photograph. (*Below*) In this chair I can bask in the sunlight and, every now and then, glance over my book out the window at the beautiful scenery. It looks like a painting, doesn’t it? I may have even peacefully dozed off for a few minutes, but that’s our secret.

My brother, Bishop Bill’s cathedras at the co-cathedrals in Pensacola and Tallahassee have nothing on this chair!

If you get to Marymount for a retreat (and I enthusiastically think you should), please visit the library and keep “my” chair warm for me! Truly a “chairway” to Heaven.

SEPTEMBER 2: This was a sad day for us because Fr. Bill McCann, who has lived here semi-permanently for three years, departed from Marymount. Fr. Bill explained his decision by stating that he is called by God to return to New Mexico, to his home Diocese of Las Cruces. He is retired, which means he is not assigned to be a pastor, but he is committed to helping his bishop and the priests of the diocese by substituting for them when they need to be gone on vacation. He is also in demand to give parish missions, especially in Advent and Lent.

Even before he was in the seminary, Father Bill was associated with The Lord's Ranch, a lay community, in Vado, NM. Their ministry is an outreach in a variety of ways to the very poor in El Paso, TX and in Ciudad Juarez over the border in Mexico. Father Bill's main residence will be there from now on. Another aspect of Father Bill's ministry, which is new as of this year, is that he has been named by his bishop, Bishop Peter Baldachino, Bishop of Las Cruces, NM, as Postulator for the cause of Father Richard Thomas, S.J., who, about 40 years ago, was the founder of The Lord's Ranch. Father Bill will serve as the diocesan postulator for the cause of canonization and a Sister in Rome is serving as the Roman postulator. Working together, Father Bill and this Sister are responsible for submitting all the required documents to eventually begin the cause in Rome. This work, while inspiring, is also complicated, intensive and demanding. It can best be done living with the sponsoring community and near the designated bishop.

We will miss Father Bill very much, but he goes with our gratitude, prayers and blessings on this next phase of his priestly ministry. Please pray with us for him. Thanks!
